

# Borderlands into Bloodlands

## The Ukrainian- Russian Border and the end of the “Post-Soviet”

With the collapse of the Soviet Union in 1991, the administrative boundary between Ukraine and the Russian Federation became an international border. For long, a common Soviet legacy in terms of political culture, institutions, and economic structures persisted along the border. The annexation of Crimea in 2014, the military conflict in Donbas, and Russia’s full-scale invasion in 2022 have dramatically transformed of the Ukrainian-Russian borderlands. The lecture will analyse the consequences of these drastic events.
